SURVEY OVERVIEW

A total of **56 individuals** completed the Lone Cone Library Site Design Survey. Almost all survey respondents are residents of Norwood, but some individuals live in a neighboring town. The survey respondents that identified as library patrons are usually visiting at least a week, checking out books and attending classes, workshops and other library events.

Within the category of new outdoor amenities, a strong need was expressed for shade sails and pergolas over the patio, as well the desire for a night sky observatory. Along trails and sidewalks, many survey respondents identified greater connectivity to Town Park, outdoor workout stations, and additional benches as features that would enhance their use of the area.

These top amenities correlated strongly with the top requested experiences survey respondents would like to have at the library. The top requested experiences at Lone Cone Library include outdoor movie nights, educational workshops such as stargazing and photography, and increased social areas for gathering with family or friends. Currently many visitors are enjoying the yoga classes, movie nights, and youth-focused programming already being offered at the library, and effort should be made to further enhanced these treasured experiences.

Overall, Lone Cone Library is valued for the great sense of community it provides, its amazing staff, and its helpful resources/library programs. Respondents provided very thoughtful and meaningful feedback that will be vital to the next design steps. A breakdown of the survey results in this report reveal many insights into the outdoor amenities and experiences that should be prioritized and the exciting future opportunities that exist for Lone Cone Library!

DEMOGRAPHIC ANALYSIS

Most survey respondents are **current library patrons** that live in Norwood (81%). Most respondents identified as **female** (72%) and most individuals fell within the **40–59 year-old** age group, followed by the 25-39 year-old age group.

While reviewing the following survey results it is important to keep these demographic factors in mind.








PATRON USE ANALYSIS


Q4: Why do/did you visit Lone Cone Library? Please select all that apply.



Q5: When you visit/visted Lone Cone Library, how do you get there? Please select all that apply.




Q6: Who are/were you usually with when you visit/visited Lone Cone Library? Please select all that apply.




OUTDOOR AMENITY ANALYSIS





OUTDOOR AMENITY ANALYSIS




